What to do if	Action needed	Back to preschool
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NHS Test and Trace has identified my child as a 'close contact' of somebody with symptoms* or confirmed COVID-19 (coronavirus)	<ul> <li>Child shouldn't attend preschool, please inform staff that your child has been identified as a 'close contact'</li> <li>Child self-isolates for 14 days (as advised by NHS Test and Trace) – even if they test negative during those 14 days</li> <li>Rest of household does not need to self-isolate, unless they are a 'close contact' too or develop symptoms themselves</li> </ul>	when the child has completed 14 days of self isolation, even if they test negative during those 14 days
we / my child has travelled and has to self-isolate	Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel	when the quarantine period of 14 days has been completed for the child, even if they test negative during those 14 days
as part of a period of	Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed:	negative during those 11 days
quarantine	<ul> <li>Child shouldn't attend preschool, please inform staff that you / your child is in quarantine</li> <li>The child and fellow travellers self-isolate for 14 days – even if they test negative during those 14 days</li> </ul>	
we have received advice from a medical / official source that my child must resume shielding	<ul> <li>Child shouldn't attend preschool, please inform staff that your child is shielding</li> <li>Contact preschool as advised by attendance officer / pastoral team</li> <li>Child should shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again</li> </ul>	when nursery / other agencies inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to preschool again
I am not sure who should get a test for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	<ul> <li>Only people with symptoms* need to get a test</li> <li>People without symptoms are not advised to get a test, even if they are a 'close contact' of someone who test positive</li> </ul>	when conditions above, as matching your situation, are met
